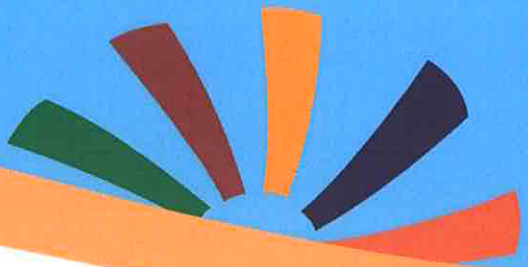

Henvey Inlet First Nation is seeking a qualified full-time **Early Childhood Education Worker** to join our Administration. The ECE Worker reports to the Daycare Supervisor and is responsible for providing supervision and direct childcare to children attending the HIFN Daycare, in compliance with all regulatory standards required by federal, provincial and First Nations legislation, policies and procedures. Under the leadership of the Daycare Supervisor, the ECE worker will help to plan and implement developmentally appropriate activities and experiences for the children using a variety of teaching techniques in alignment with HIFN Daycare Philosophy. This position requires excellent interpersonal communication skills and the ability to adapt and respond to all childcare needs.

Henvey Inlet First Nation is seeking a **Secondary School Bus Driver** to join our Administration for a temporary, short-term contract up to six months. The Secondary School Bus Driver reports to the Education Counsellor and is responsible for transporting students of various ages to and from their homes and respective schools in a timely and safe manner and in accordance with MTO driving regulations, Ontario traffic laws and safe driving practices. This position requires excellent organization, communication and customer service skills.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

The Secondary School Bus Driver will be responsible to:

- Ensure bus is well-maintained and operational by conducting daily safety checks on both interior and exterior of school bus prior to operating vehicle
- Report any bus malfunctions or needed repairs
- Safely deliver students to and from their homes and schools, following the assigned time schedule.
- Assist students with boarding and exiting the bus and while crossing the street as needed
- Adhere to and enforce bus safety rules and standards

The Ontario Works Administrator reports to the Director of Finance/Administration and is responsible for the financial management and administration of the Social Assistance Program to ensure effective, efficient and accurate operations in accordance with the Ontario Works (OW) directives and current legislation. The Ontario Works Administrator is also responsible for assessing eligibility requirements of applicants seeking assistance based on the Ontario Works Act. This position requires exceptional organizational and interpersonal communication skills.

Henvey Inlet First Nation offers competitive wages, paid vacation and personal emergency days, an incredible pension and benefit package, on-site daycare services for working parents, fifteen paid federal, provincial and First Nations holidays, annual cultural leave, paid Christmas break, and half-day workdays every Friday.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

The Ontario Works Administrator will be responsible to:

- Research, develop and plan OW program structure and seek and apply for program funding
- Assist in the coordination and delivery of workshops, info sessions and other Social Assistance Program events
- Carry out interviews and complete applications to assess and determine eligibility of clients under the Ontario Works Act
- Refer and help clients apply for other available sources of income including CPP, EI, ODSP, etc.
- Connect with external agencies and program sponsors to develop employment opportunities for OW clients
- Maintain a broad knowledge of local resources available to assist clients in achieving goals

POSITION SUMMARY

Henvey Inlet First Nation is currently seeking two temporary, full-time **Brush Cutter Workers** to join our Administration for a short-term contract up to 18 weeks. The Brush Cutter Worker reports to the Director of Finance/Administration and is responsible to cut and remove trees, vegetation and debris along the designated project areas as assigned. This position requires a high degree of self-motivation and a strong work ethic.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

The Brush Cutter Worker will be responsible to:

- Perform required maintenance for safe operation of chainsaw, brush saw and related equipment, ensuring all gas, oil and fluids are topped-up at the end of each use, noting brush cutter project account for the fuel charges at the Gas Bar
- Operate brush saw, chainsaw or any other equipment in a safe and responsible manner while wearing all required personal protective equipment
- Cut trees and brush within the designated Hydro One project areas including around all hydro lines throughout Pickerel, Myltons Lane, and Hwy 69
- Ensure that all trees, brush and debris, including garbage, is cleared away and brought to designated drop-off area
- Transport required band-owned equipment to and from respective job site
- Return equipment to secure storage area at the end of each shift

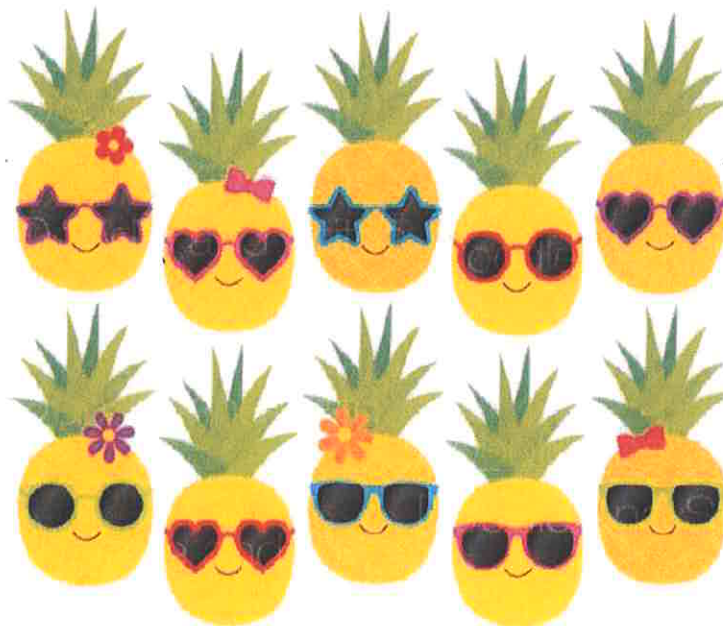

Mno-waawiindandaa Anishinaabe Giizhigad!

Let's celebrate Anishinaabe Day!

June 6

The Anishinabek Nation is celebrating Anishinaabe Giizhigad on June 6 to honour our past, present, and future. In the simplest terms, we are strengthening our Nation and providing a good future, an Anishinaabe future, for our children.

Our greatest strength is our Anishinaabe ways: our language, culture, history, and traditions. This is how we have survived genocide and this is how we will strengthen our people and ensure our future. We have much to celebrate!

On November 17, 2021, the Anishinabek Nation Leadership Council proclaimed June 6 as Anishinaabe Giizhigad our very own national holiday.

June 6 commemorates the proclamation of the Anishinaabe Chi-Naaknigewin (Anishinabek Nation Constitution) by the Anishinabek Nation Grand Council, held at the Roundhouse in Sheguiandah First Nation on June 6, 2012.

The adoption of the Anishinaabe Chi-Naaknigewin was then confirmed by The Pipe Ceremony and so, it is a sacred commitment to live according to Anishinaabe principles and law. Our principles and laws are expressed in the Preamble of the Anishinaabe Chi-Naaknigewin. The Preamble, Ngo Dwe Waangizid Anishinaabe (One Anishinaabe Family) was guided, created, and gifted to us by our Elders and provides the spirit and intent, and the vision and purpose of the Anishinaabe Chi-Naaknigewin.

Ngo Dwe Waangizid Anishinaabe states:

"Creator placed Anishinaabe on the Earth along with the Gift of Spirituality. Here on Mother Earth, there were Gifts given to Anishinaabe to look after: Fire, Water, Earth, and Air.

The Creator also gave Anishinaabe Seven Sacred Gifts to guide them. They are: Love, Truth, Respect, Wisdom, Humility, To Live a Good Life, and Bravery.

Creator gave us sovereignty to govern ourselves.
We respect and honour the past, present and future."

To live according to Anishinaabe principles and law, we must acquire and practice Anishinaabemowin (Language) and Anishinaabe Inaadziwin (Culture), always. This is the source of Anishinabek nationhood, identity, and pride.

This is how we provide for future generations. This is why we will celebrate June 6 each year.

"We should celebrate on June 6th; that is our national holiday, not June 21,"

EXTREME	COMPLETE FIRE BAN NO BURNING ALLOWED at anytime. NO FIREWORKS

Burn Barrels

- may not be larger than 3 ft in diameter and must have a 3/8 mesh lid

Camp Fire Pit

- No larger than 2 ft, must be surrounded by stone or metal
- Any Fire, Camp Fire Pit, Barrel, or Incinerator
- Must always be monitored by a responsible person until extinguished
 - Must have a source of extinguishment at fire/barrel
 - at least 5 metres from any forest area
 - at least 2 metres from any flammable material

With the 2023 FIRE SEASON Upon Us

Here is what you need to know, please keep this for your records for the remainder of the fire season and keep watch on the fire rating signs on Pickerel River Road and Beckanon Road to keep up with the current fire danger rating.

The LAW

If you live in Northwestern, Northern or Central Ontario, you must follow certain rules to have an outdoor fire.

By law to burn wood, brush, leaves and grass outside during the Fire season, April 1 to October 31, you **MUST** follow all the rules outlined below and;

- Conditions allow it to burn safely until extinguished
- You take all necessary steps to tend, control and extinguish the fire
- You are not having an open fire in a restricted fire zone
- **The current fire danger rating allows it**

If you don't burn safely you can be fined and held responsible for the cost of putting out the fire and for any property damage.

Rules to burn Wood, Brush and Leaves

To burn piled wood, brush, leaves or wood by-products if you follow these rules:

- Ignite the fire no sooner than 2 hours before sunset and extinguish it no later than 2 hours after sunrise
- Burn only a single pile at any one time
- Ensure the pile is less than 2 meters in diameter (wide) and less than 2 meters high (tall)
- Keep the fire at least 2 meters away from any flammable materials
- Have tools or water adequate to contain the fire at the fire site
- Ensure a responsible person tends the fire until it is extinguished

Using an Incinerator/Burn Barrel

To burn piled wood, brush, leaves or wood by-products in an incinerator if you:

- Ensure the incinerator is an enclosed device constructed entirely of non-combustible material
- Cover the incinerator with a metal screen having a mesh size of not more than 5 millimeters
- Keep the incinerator at least 5 meters from any forest area
- Keep the incinerator at least 2 meters from any flammable material
- Ensure a responsible person monitors the fire until it is extinguished
- No toxic materials, (garbage, plastic, diapers, bottles)

Rules to burn grass or leaf litter

To burn areas of grass or leaf litter on land you lawfully occupy if you:

- Ignite the fire no sooner than 2 hours before sunset and extinguish it no later than 2 hours after sunrise
- Keep the total area to be burned under 1 hectare
- Ensure the flaming edge of the fire does not exceed 30 meters in length
- Have tools or water adequate to contain the fire at the fire site
- Ensure a responsible person tends the fire until it is extinguished

Fire Danger Rating Definitions:

Low

- Approved incinerators and outdoor fireplaces
- Burning of natural wood and wood products for campfires allowed (campfire must be in an appropriate enclosure, steel or stone ring no more than 2 feet in diameter (across))
- Burning of brush and leaves

Moderate

- Approved incinerators and outdoor fireplaces
- Burning of natural wood and wood products for campfires allowed (campfire must be in an appropriate enclosure, steel or stone ring no more than 2 feet in diameter (across))

High

- No open burning including incinerators and outdoor fireplaces
- Campfires for cooking and warmth only when no other such means available (campfire must be in an appropriate enclosure, steel or stone ring no more than 2 feet in diameter (across))
- **NO FIREWORKS**

Extreme

- **NO OPEN BURNING**
- **Campfires not allowed except for those in organized campgrounds**
